# Day 1 Child safeguarding in communication.

- - Creation of awareness on online safety; information sharing, engaging strangers, online footprints, privacy settings in social media accounts.
- - Cyber bullying awareness, respectful interactions and setting firm boundaries
- Consent from parents and assent for children before posting images or their stories online.
- -Definition of Online Child Sexual Exploitation & Abuse (OCSEA) Explain what online child sexual exploitation and abuse is, using age-appropriate language.
- - Types of OCSEA Discuss different forms, such as grooming, sextortion,

### Day 1 Cont'

- -Privacy Settings Show how to use privacy settings on various platforms to enhance security.
- -Parental Controls Discuss the role of parental controls and how they can help protect children.
- -Recognizing risky predators and redflags in online communication
- -How to Report Provide clear instructions on how to report suspicious or harmful online activities.
- -Trusted Adults and Resources Encourage children to talk to trusted adults and provide information on helplines and support organizations.
- -Data privacy- Limiting information sharing to safe platforms and avoiding actual names and physical locations for children.
- -Cultural sensitivity & use of child friendly language

## <u>Day 2</u> <u>Safeguarding responsibilities for reseachers</u>

- -Understanding legal & ethical considerations of doing no harm, avoiding child exploitation.
- -Following policies stipulated by the institution on data privacy, child protection.
- -Informed consent & assent before engaging children in research through parents/guardians as well as participant child.
- -Confidentiality in providing details of a child in research findings as well as privacy to images and critical information about children
- -Collaboration with protection agencies and stakeholders to ensure children are protected during & after research period.

#### <u>Day 3</u> <u>Localisation & working with partners on child safeguarding.</u>

- -Community engagement on safeguarding to make it sustainable and accepted way of life.
- -Shared decision making through involving local actors in formulation of safeguarding policies to enhance relevance.
- -Capacity building to ensure that local actors handle sensitive safeguarding issues appropriately.
- -Resources mobilization and cost sharing on safeguarding cases to access adequate support & justice in the long run.

## <u>Day 4</u> <u>Child safeguarding responsibilities for trustees & leaders</u>

- -Ensuring organizations are compliant with national laws and regulations on safeguarding e.g children's Act, education act.
- -Formulation of organisational safeguarding policies with outlined commitment and consequences for bleach of the policies.
- -Establishing zero tolerance approach to child abuse and exploitation at all levels in the organisation.
- -Ensuring presence of a trained safeguarding lead and an oversight expert to assess and support all cases involving protection.
- -Effective reporting mechanisms and risk management models for safeguarding cases to prevent reoccurence.
- -Child centered approach to safeguarding matters and ensuring children are given platform to give views on matters concerning them.

#### Cont' Trustees & Leaders responsibilities

- -Collaboration with external agencies in safeguarding eg directorate of children services and stakeholders in protecting children
- -Accountability and governance, ensuring that team members are held accountable, conducting regular reviews of policies and audits.
- -Proper storage of safeguarding data in private drives or cabinets with limited access in order to avoid doing harm by exposing information to unauthorized persons.
